CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship program for Cherokee citizens who are high school juniors or seniors who are taking required general education courses at a college or university while still in high school. Residency restrictions apply, see map on reverse side for service area. No private or proprietary institutions.

VALEDICTORIAN & SALUTATORIAN SCHOLARSHIP (Val/Sal)

A one-time scholarship program for Cherokee citizens who are high school seniors who have been named as the Valedictorian or Salutatorian. Must have a 3.5 GPA or above. Residency restrictions apply, see map on reverse side for service area.

UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship program for Cherokee citizens working toward their first Associate of Arts or Associate of Science or toward a Bachelor's degree. Associate of Applied Science (Nursing) may be eligible. Must apply for the federal PELL grant at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Applicants living outside the designated service area (see map on reverse side) must be eligible for the federal PELL grant.

GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship program for Cherokee citizens seeking their first Masters or Doctorate degree. Residency restrictions apply, see map on reverse side for service area.

STOLE PROGRAM

The Cherokee Nation Stole program is available for college/university students or faculty who are current citizens of the Cherokee Nation and graduating 2019 and forward. Under this program, students or faculty members who are Cherokee Nation tribal citizens, regardless of residency, will receive one graduation stole, as long as eligibility requirements are met.

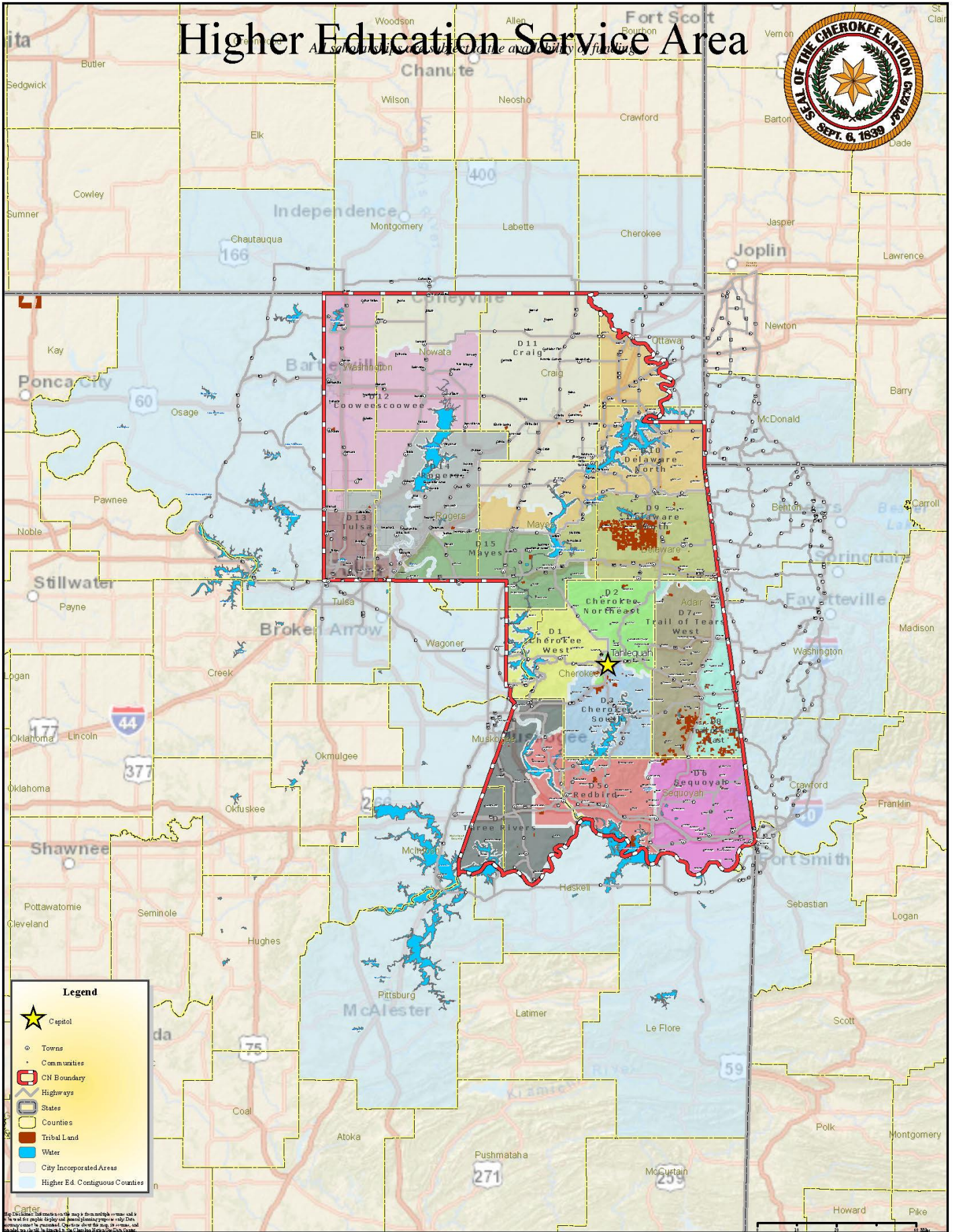
